Introduction

- Project manager at WUS Austria and coordinator of the "Brain Gain Programme Plus"
- WUS Austria is a non for profit NGO committed to the promotion of the human right to education, established in Graz in 1983
- Besides the head office in Graz it has offices in Sarajevo and Prishtina and it implements activities in Europe, Asia and Northern Africa with focus on South-Eastern Europe
- WUS Austria offers services in four main areas:
 - Higher Education Development
 - Linking Higher Education with Economy and Society
 - Higher Education and Human Rights
 - Technical Support

Introduction – Brain Gain Program (+)

With the aim of using the **potential of migrants**, WUS Austria has developed a measure – which has become well accepted in SEE over the years – which brings emigrated academics **back** to their home country/ region providing teaching and research capacities at the universities that are still lacking in these countries, while at the same time individual and institutional cooperation is being built.

Structure of the Brain Gain Program (+)

In 2007, BGP was upgraded to BGP+, with the following components:

- ▶ **BGP+ classic**: teaching, 1-3 weeks stay
- BGP+ with extended period of stay (one semester):
 - Teaching and mentoring
 - Teaching, mentoring and research
- A database was developed containing offered and demanded courses and research projects
- Since 2002, over 600 guest lectures took place in the frame of BGP, thereof:
 - 218 in Bosnia and Herzegovina
 - ▶ 101 in Kosovo
 - ▶ 60 in Montenegro
 - 309 in Serbia

Brain Gain Program (+) - Objectives

- Fill in gaps in teaching and research
- Introduce new teaching and research methods and up-todate literature
- Curricula development (e.g. introduction of new and modification of existing courses)
- Enhancement of international cooperation
 - Cooperation with the Diaspora
 - Student and staff exchange
- Brain gain




- Development of international cooperation
- Quality improvement

Impact analysis – questionnaires and sample

- Online questionnaires in .pdf form
- Anonymous survey
- Part 1: general impressions about the project and motivation (large scale with possibility of multiple answers + open questions)
- Part 2: actual impact (scale of 1 to 4 + "I don't know")
- Pre-test in October -> small adaptation of the questionnaires
- Duration: end of December 2010 until March 2011 covering the entire period of project duration from 2002



Reasons for participation in the Program – Guest lecturers




Reasons for participation in the Program – Hosting institutions

Q1:Reasons for participation in the BGP project




Q7: Number of BGP visits per guest lecturer




Q6:Number of visits per single guest lecturer




Q7: Number of hosted guest lecturers within BGP project



Q11: Local lecturers' visits to the guest lecturer's inst.


Q25: Continued cooperation: Lecturers - Guest lecturers



Results – Cooperation with students


Q13: Students' visits to the guest lecturer's institution

Q28:Continued cooperation: Students - Guest lecturer




Q18: Assistance in development of new study programmes




Q19: Participation in the development of new courses

Concluding remarks

- The majority of lecturers is at least considering repatriation
- Mobility of the lecturers and students from the hosting institution to the guest lecturers' institutions has taken place and is planned in the future
- Guest lecturers are involved in the projects other than BGP in the host country
- Guest lecturers initiated other projects and other cooperation for the hosting institution
- Positive impact on the improvement of quality of education at the hosting institution (content and methods)
- On-going support
- Big and positive influence of the students' academic development (mobility and research interest)
- **Sustainability** (mobility, follow-up activities and projects)
